Shalom Rescue Foundation works with the most vulnerable groups in the society especially children and adolescents who suffer as a result of abuse (directly or indirectly). We ensure that they live a happy and healthy life in a safe environment through our livelihood, partnership, advocacy and referral programs.

"Operation Hope" is an initiative developed to foster collaboration with other likeminded Organization or Individuals in bringing hope to children and adolescents who are going through challenges.

In this case, we joined forces with a team led by the Psycho-Social Unit at Connaught Hospital on Thursday 5th January 2023 in complementing their work at the Pediatric Ward (Ward One) by sharing gifts to these children with health challenge.

THE STORY OF 10 YEARS OLD "AMINATA"



(A safe space for survivor to express themselves)

Aminata is a promising girl that started her early education in the provinces (Masinbi Village). At the age of six (6), she came to Freetown to live with her Aunt.

Unfortunately, things started getting sour when her aunt starts giving preferential treatment in favor of her own children. She physically and verbally abuses Aminata and sends her out of the house for minor mistakes.

On an occasion when she was thrown out of the house, she encountered a man who offered to help her with food – not knowing his actual intension was to abuse her sexually. She resisted - fought him off, then reported the incident to her Aunt.

The man (perpetrator) happens to be a close friend to the family. At the end of the day, they accused her of enticing the man, and threatened her with severe punishment if she tells anyone about the "attempted rape" and physical assault.

This traumatic event led to loss of sleep, inattentiveness in class and withdrawal.

The V4J facilitators who also serve as counselors upon hearing her story provided her with professional psychosocial support. They further visited the home and engaged her Aunt. The Aunt apologized and promise total commitment to protect and take good care of Aminata.

Now, Aminata is happy and doing very well in her school work. She can now tell her story without being ashamed or stigmatized.

We continue to do our follow-up as total healing is a process.
